Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Galatians was written by the apostle Paul to several early Christian communities in the province of Galatia, which is modern-day Turkey (see <u>Acts 13-14</u>). In this letter, Paul faces head on how these young Christians were being misled and missing out on the true freedom found only in the *Good News* of Jesus Christ.

Read Galatians 2:11-14.

- 1. Why did Paul oppose Peter?
- 2. What is *hypocrisy* (see also: <u>Matthew 23:27-28</u>; <u>Mark 7:6-8</u>; <u>James</u> <u>3:17</u>)? How was Peter being hypocritical? What caused his hypocrisy?
- 3. What affect was Peter's hypocrisy having on others?
- 4. How have you seen hypocrisy in your own life? In others?

Read Galatians 2:15-21.

- 5. How is a person *made right with God* (see also <u>Romans 3:20-31</u>)?
- 6. What does it mean that *the law has been torn down* (vs. 18)?

- 7. What nonessential customs or practices do we force on each other?
- 8. How would you summarize, in very practical terms, <u>vs. 20-21</u>? What does this look like in everyday life?
- 9. How could you motivate yourself, and other believers, with more grace and less guilt?
- 10. What steps is God's Spirit leading you to take this week?
