Conversation Starter

If you had a garden, what would you plant?

Opening in Prayer

Then Christ will make His home in your hearts as you trust in Him. Your roots will
grow down into God's love and keep you strong.Ephesians 3:17 (NLT)

Spend a few minutes in prayer asking God to build your trust in Him, and to reveal His love for you as you study His Word.

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Jesus used the image of a vine as the central source from which all other branches grow and produce fruit.

Read <u>John 15:1-8</u>.

- 1. When you think of a vine and branches, what plant comes to your mind?
- 2. Why would you want to cut off a branch that's not producing fruit?
- 3. How does God point out, or prune away, areas of one's life that are hindering the growth of a relationship with Jesus?
- 4. What part does the believer play in bearing the fruit of a relationship with Jesus?
- 5. What fruit should be displayed by the person who's in a growing relationship with Jesus?

- 6. If someone is not connected with Christ, what's their life like (<u>Romans 8:6</u>)?
- 7. What are the keys to answered prayer in <u>verse 7</u>?
- 8. What steps can you take to remain in Christ, to strengthen your connection to Him?

Read <u>John 15:9-11</u>.

- 9. What benefits do we enjoy when we remain in Christ?
- 10. What do you see in this passage that can help you experience joy this week?

Soul Training

A key to answered prayer is that the words of Christ are remaining in us. Ask Jesus what He wants you to pray, and pray according to the words He puts in your mind.
