Conversation Starter

Describe a time you felt inadequate.

Begin your study with prayer

Pause for a few minutes to quiet your heart and mind. Ask God for insight and direction as you study and reflect on this week's lesson.

Bible Study and Group Discussion

Read <u>Mark 5:25-34</u>.

- 1. What would you consider the worst of this woman's problems physical suffering, being financially drained, being a social outcast, always being religiously impure, or guilt and shame?
- 2. What kinds of doubts or feelings toward God may have arisen in those 12 years?
- 3. Why do you think God allows suffering?
- 4. How has physical suffering affected your relationship with God and others?
- 5. The woman spent all of her money and a great deal of effort to end her suffering. Do you think taking medicine and seeking medical treatment demonstrates a lack of faith? Why or why not?
- 6. How can we genuinely have hope without denying our pain or trying to escape it?

- 7. When have you experienced God in times of suffering?
- 8. When do you remember being the most desperate for God's help?
- 9. How can you keep growing spiritually during extended periods of pain, trial or suffering?
- 10. The woman reached out to Jesus for help. In what way is God inviting you to reach out to Him now?
- 11. Does this passage of Scripture leave you feeling closer to God or further away? Explain.
