Conversation Starter

What is one thing you're looking forward to?

Begin your study with prayer

Pause for a few minutes to quiet your heart and mind. Ask God to help you experience His love and hear His voice as you reflect on this week's lesson.

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read <u>Hebrews 11:35-40</u>.

- 1. List some of the fretful challenges these people of faith endured.
- 2. How is it possible that being a Christian can actually make some things harder?
- 3. What are some of the reasons God does not always deliver those who trust in Him?
- 4. What caused these men and women of faith to endure such extreme persecution?
- 5. Name different ways people respond when faced with hardship and suffering.
- 6. Why is the world a difficult place for people of faith (vs. 38)? See also: <u>2 Corinthians 4:3-4</u>; <u>1 John 5:19</u>.
- 7. What did God provide for us that's *better* (vs. 40)? See also: <u>1 Corinthians 15:51-54</u>; <u>Titus 2:13</u>.

- 8. How does your view of heaven impact your life today?
- 9. While none of us seeks difficulty, how might these verses encourage us to endure when we face trials and persecution because of our faith? See also: <u>Deuteronomy 31:6, 8</u>, <u>Joshua 1:5, 1 Chronicles 28:20</u>.
- 10. How are you different than the people described in this passage? In what ways are you the same?
- 11. Jesus suffered the greatest trial and torture death on a cross. How does this give you hope as you seek to follow God in faith?

Soul Training

Practice listening to God. Meditate on <u>Psalm 91</u>. Which words or phrases seem most significant for your life right now? Ask God to fill your mind with His thoughts, and wait for Him to speak.
