Conversation Starter

Describe a time you felt like giving up.

Begin your study with prayer

Pause for a few minutes to quiet your heart and mind. Then ask God for insight and direction as you study and reflect on this week's lesson.

Bible Study and Group Discussion

Read 2 Corinthians 4:1-18.

- 1. What's the *new way* Paul describes in <u>vs. 1-2</u>?
- 2. In what ways was Paul a servant (vs. 2-5)?
- 3. Why did Paul compare God making His light shine in people's hearts (vs. 6) to the creation account of <u>Genesis 1</u>? What are some ways God's actions in salvation are similar to His actions in creation?
- 4. What's Paul trying to communicate with the metaphor of *fragile clay jars* (vs. 7)?
- 5. Have you ever felt empowered by God to share the Gospel? If so, give an example.
- 6. Why do you think Paul refers to his sufferings as the death of Jesus (vs. 10)?
- 7. As you look over chapter 4, how did Paul keep from losing heart even though he encountered much suffering in his ministry?

- 8. What would it look like to fix your eyes on *things that cannot be seen* (<u>vs.</u> <u>16-18</u>)? What are practical ways to do that?
- 9. In what ways have you experienced renewal? How could this motivate you to share the Gospel?
- 10. What's your biggest takeaway from this week's lesson?
- 11. For further study, consider ways <u>Psalm 116</u> fits together with <u>vs. 13-18</u>.
