Conversation Starter

What brings you joy?

Begin your study with prayer

Pause for a few minutes to quiet your heart and mind. Ask God to help you experience His love and hear His voice as you reflect on this week's lesson.

Bible Study and Group Discussion

Biblical joy: a positive state of being, like contentment or satisfaction, produced by the Holy Spirit.

Read <u>Luke 1:26-38</u>.

- 1. How would you feel if an angel appeared and said, The Lord is with you?
- 2. Which of Mary's responses indicate she may not have been experiencing joy at that moment? Why do you think so?
- 3. Which of Mary's responses indicate she was experiencing joy? Explain.
- 4. What is the source of Mary's joy in this passage?

Read Luke 1:39-45.

- 5. Verse 44 says that the baby in Elizabeth's womb *jumped for joy*. What was the source or cause of the baby's joy?
- 6. What phrases spoken by Elizabeth indicate the Holy Spirit revealed things to her she didn't already know?

- 7. What was Mary's step to receiving the joy God wanted to give her?
- 8. What is hindering you from experiencing the joy God wants to give you?
- 9. What step can you take to experience God's joy this Christmas season?

Spiritual Practice

Spiritual Practices help us experience the Holy Spirit's work in our lives. They're meant to be more than one-time actions, becoming a natural part of our lives.

The words and presence of the Holy Spirit were sources of joy in this story of Mary and Elizabeth. **Thank God for being with you, and ask Him which word or phrase He wants you to remember when you read a Scripture passage.** Try it with today's study passage, <u>Luke 1:26-45</u>.
