Opening in Prayer

Spend a few minutes in silence. Ask God to quiet your heart and guide your time studying the Bible.

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Galatians was written by the apostle Paul to several early Christian communities in the province of Galatia, which is modern-day Turkey (see Acts 13-14). In this letter, Paul faces head on how these young Christians were being misled and missing out on the true freedom found only in the *Good News* of Jesus Christ.

Read Galatians 3:15-20.

- 1. What does it look like to receive and experience a promise from God?
- 2. Why did God give us the law? What results was God looking for when He gave the law?
- 3. Why didn't God need a mediator when He gave the promise to Abraham? Why is that significant?

Read Genesis 15:1-21.

- 4. How would you summarize this passage?
- 5. How do the details of God's covenant-making ceremony with Abram encourage you? See also Genesis 12:1-9; 17:1-8.

Read Galatians 3:21-22.

- 6. What does it mean that we are all prisoners of sin?
- 7. How have you received God's *promise of freedom*? What impact has that had on you?
- 8. What steps could you take to more fully understand and experience the freedom given to us in Jesus Christ?
- 9. To help diagnose your own heart, ask yourself: *What causes me to feel despair in life? What do I think God feels about me?*
