# **Conversation Starter**

Recall a moment when you received news that was so good you could hardly believe it.

## **Opening in Prayer**

Begin with a few minutes of silence. Ask God to open your heart and mind so you can hear His voice. Ask Him to help you respond to what He reveals to you as you study and reflect on this week's lesson.

# Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

#### Read <u>Matthew 27:45-54</u>.

- 1. Why did Jesus feel abandoned by God? For further insight, read <u>2 Corinthians 5:18-21; 1 Peter 2:22-25</u>.
- 2. How would you explain why Jesus had to die to someone who really wanted to understand? What would you say that might compel them to open their heart to Him?
- 3. What specific statements in <u>Isaiah 53:1-12</u> help you understand the significance and purpose of Jesus' death?
- 4. What was the immediate impact of Jesus' death?
- 5. As you read this passage, what did you notice, perhaps for the first time?
- 6. What does Jesus' death mean for you personally? How have you experienced the heart of God when contemplating the cross?
- 7. What are some practical steps you can take to help you more fully appreciate Jesus' death?

# **Digging Deeper**

- 8. One of the results of Jesus' crucifixion is that there is no more veil separating us from God. Read <u>Hebrews 9:1-10</u>; <u>10:19-23</u> and <u>this article</u>, then consider these questions: What's the significance of the curtain in the sanctuary of the Temple being torn in two, from top to bottom (<u>Matthew 27:50-52</u>)? Why does this matter? How does this impact your ability to experience the heart of God and have a closer relationship with Him?
- 9. Read <u>Psalm 22</u>. David was chased by his enemies. Write down at least three ways David's experience was similar to Jesus' experience in the story of the crucifixion.
