# **Discussion Guide**

#### Joshua J. Masters August 23, 2020

Use this guide by yourself or with friends to study the Bible and pursue a deeper relationship with God.

#### **Conversation Starter**

When you were in high school, what was one of the most daring things you tried?

## Begin your study with prayer

Pause for a few minutes to quiet your heart and mind. Ask God to help you experience His love and hear His voice as you reflect on this week's lesson.

#### Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

#### Read Joshua 2:1-14 and Hebrews 11:31.

1. Describe the scene. What would you be feeling if you were there?

- 2. What do you learn about Rahab from this passage?
- 3. Rahab proclaims the authority and power of God (vs <u>9-11</u>). She has experienced Him personally (vs <u>9.11</u>), and calls the Lord by His personal name (five times in verses <u>9-14</u>). Why do you think the writer included these details in the story?
- 4. Why did Rahab provide safety for the two spies?
- 5. When have you experienced the kindness of God?
- 6. If you're honest, in what ways are you like Rahab?
- 7. Have you ever felt like God was leading you into a dangerous situation or conversation? What was that like for you? How did you respond?

- 8. Why do you think God used Rahab in His plan to take His people to the Promised Land? What does that tell you about God?
- 9. Have you ever trusted someone who betrayed you? Describe. What impact has this had on your thoughts of God?
- 10. Who in your life displays great faith? What do they do that reveals their faith, and how could you follow their example?

## **Digging Deeper**

#### Read <u>Hebrews 11:31</u> and <u>Joshua 3</u>.

- a) In your own words, summarize these passages.
- b) The Israelites took several steps of faith. What were they? How do you think they knew that's what God wanted them to do?
- c) What's one major truth you see in these passages?
- d) How can you apply this truth to your life?

### **Soul Training**

Practice listening to God. Meditate on <u>Psalm 23</u>, focusing on specific words and phrases. What does this stir in you? Ask God to tell you what He wants you to know, and wait for Him to speak.
