Discussion Guide

Conversation Starter

Describe a time when someone asked you to do something that was difficult or scary, but that you knew would also be good. What was your initial reaction to the request?

Opening in Prayer

Spend several minutes in silence with God. Ask Him to guide your heart and mind as you study and reflect.

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read <u>Luke 1:1-25</u>.

- 1. Vs. 1-4 form a prologue to the Gospel of Luke. What does this introduction tell us about Luke's purposes and methods?
- 2. Why do you think Luke included details about Herod?
- 3. Describe Zechariah and Elizabeth. Who are they and what was their life like before the angel visited?
- 4. What is Luke seeking to emphasize through the details he chooses to tell of Hezekiah and Elizabeth's story?
- 5. How does this opening section of Luke prepare us for the story of the birth of Jesus?
- 6. Describe a recent time you sensed God was speaking to you or leading you. How did you know it was God?
- 7. Have you ever been unsure (or doubted) that God would come through for you? What was that like?

- Being blessed by God is a common theme in the Bible (for examples, see <u>Genesis 1:26-28; 9:1-3; 25:7-11; Deuteronomy 2:1-7; Psalm 115:9-18;</u> <u>Luke 1:39-45; 1 Peter 4:12-14</u>). What blessings (or benefits) do we receive when we trust God?
- 9. When God doesn't give us what we want (or what we think we need), how can those times draw us closer to God rather than push us away?
- 10. If someone said to you *I can't possibly believe in God, just look at all the tragedy in the world*... how would you respond?
