Conversation Starter

When you think of *freedom*, what comes to mind?

Opening in Prayer

Thank God for freedom and life. Spend a few minutes quieting your heart, asking God to guide your time in study and personal reflection.

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Galatians was written by the apostle Paul to several early Christian communities in the province of Galatia, which is modern-day Turkey (see Acts 13-14). In this letter, Paul addresses how these young Christians were being misled and missing out on the true freedom found only in the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Read Galatians 5:1-15.

- 1. Imagine talking with Paul about this passage of Scripture. What questions would you ask him?
- 2. What does it mean to be **free in Christ**? How is Christian freedom different than the freedom we hear about in our culture? See also: James 4:1-4; 1 John 2:15-17.
- 3. What are some present-day threats to our spiritual freedom?
- 4. What are practical ways to stand firm against these threats? See also: 1 Corinthians 15:58; 16:13-14.
- 5. A repeated theme in Galatians is justification by faith. What does that phrase mean? See also: Romans 3:23-28: 4:4-5.
- 6. What's the difference between being religious and expressing faith through love? Give examples.

- 7. How could your relationship with Jesus become more of a treasure for you? How would your life be different?
- 8. Paul compares the Galatians to runners in a race and to a batch of dough (vs. 7-9). What do these illustrations teach you about life as a Christian?
- 9. What does it mean that the cross is offensive (vs. 11)? See also: 1 Corinthians 1:18; 2 Corinthians 2:14-16.
- 10. What are some ways in which the misuse of Christian freedom could lead to self-indulgence?
- 11. What truth or Bible verse from this week's teaching is most significant to you? Why?
