Conversation Starter

Describe a time you were in a heated debate.

Bible Study and Group Discussion

Read Acts 23:1-5.

- 1. What words would you use to describe Paul?
- 2. Describe a time you said something but wished you hadn't. Did you admit your mistake?
- 3. Why must we submit to governing authorities (see Romans 13:1-5)? Is there a time or situation we shouldn't submit to them?
- 4. When you're in a conversation, how do you know when it's best to keep silent and when it's time to voice your opinion?

Read Acts 23:6-10.

- 5. What argument was Paul having with the Sadducees and Pharisees? Which group supported Paul, and which one was against him?
- 6. What are some of your beliefs that no one can talk you out of?

Read Acts 23:11-35.

- 7. How did God protect Paul?
- 8. What are examples of religious and political conflicts throughout the world?
- 9. In what ways are you like and unlike Paul in your response to being falsely accused?
