Conversation Starter

Opening in Prayer

Spend a few minutes in silence. Ask God to speak to you personally and to help you to hear His voice.

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read Exodus 3:11-22.

- 1. What were some things God told Moses?
- 2. How do you think Moses knew it was God speaking?
- 3. How did Moses respond?
- 4. Do you believe God speaks to you? What's your belief based on? For further insight, read <u>Isaiah 30:21</u>; <u>Jeremiah 33:3</u>; <u>John 10:1-5</u>; <u>Revelation 3:20</u>.
- 5. Have you ever read the Bible or had a thought come to mind when you were convinced God was speaking to you? If so, what was that like?
- 6. If someone asked you, *how can I tell if God is speaking to me or if it's just my own thought*, what would you say?

Read John 16:13; Philippians 1:12-14; 2 Timothy 3:16-17; James 1:5.

- 7. According to these passages, what are various ways God speaks to us?
- 8. What do you sense God is saying to you from these passages?

Read <u>Romans 8:31-39</u>.

9. What words or phrases seem to jump off the page at you?

10. What do you sense God is saying to you from this passage?

11. How will you respond to what you've heard?
