### **Bible Study and Group Discussion**

#### Read Matthew 27:45-49.

- 1. What significance is there that *darkness fell across the whole land*? Why do you think Matthew included this detail?
- 2. Why did God abandon Jesus?
- 3. Have you ever felt abandoned by God? Describe.
- 4. Share a time someone showed you great compassion.
- 5. Why did some of the bystanders think Jesus was calling for Elijah? For further insight, read <u>Malachi 4:1-6</u>.
- 6. Has God ever used something awful in your life to bring about something good? Explain.
- 7. If someone asked you why Christians participate in The Lord's Supper, what would you tell them?

- 8. Read Philippians 3:8-11. What does it mean to share in Jesus' death?
- 9. Spend a few minutes in quiet, asking God how He wants you to respond to this week's lesson.

#### **Digging Deeper**

The moment Jesus died, a holy transaction took place. God the Father regarded God the Son as if He were a sinner. Jesus was cut off from the Father. As the Apostle Paul would later write, *God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.* **2 Corinthians 5:21 (NIV)** 

Study these passages and write down what they say about Jesus' death: John 1:10-13, 29; Acts 2:22-24; 5:30-32; Colossians 2:13-15.

#### **Spiritual Practice**

Spiritual Practices put us in a place to experience God and grow in faith. These practices can be incorporated into your ongoing relationship with God.

Write *Jesus died for me* on a notecard. Reflect on this truth throughout the week, and ask God to show you what this means for your life.
