Spend a few moments in prayer, asking God to guide your time in His Word.

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read Daniel 2:1-13.

- 1. Why do you think it was so important to Nebuchadnezzar that he understand the dream? What were his motives?
- 2. Why did he demand they recount the dream itself as well as explain its meaning?
- 3. Why were Daniel and his friends included in the execution order?
- 4. How do you think you would have responded if you were Daniel?

Read Daniel 2:14-28.

- 5. How does Daniel demonstrate wisdom in the way he approaches this situation?
- 6. What do we learn about God from vs. 20-23?

Read Daniel 2:25-49.

- 7. What's the point of the dream? How would you summarize it?
- 8. Judging from the response of the king (vs. 46-47), Daniel was right on about the dream and its meaning. What impact did this have on the lives of Daniel and his friends? On the king and his men?
- 9. How does this story connect to your life? Name at least one truth or application that's relevant for you.

Growing in Wisdom

10. Throughout the Bible, we learn that wisdom is found through a relationship with God, not in philosophies or education apart from God. Read <u>Colossians 2:1-10</u>. How can we grow in true wisdom? See also: Proverbs 1:1-7; Job 28:12-28; Ecclesiastes 12:13-14.

Soul Training

Pause. Quiet your heart. Then read Proverbs 2:6-7 out loud several times. With humility, ask God to give you wisdom about specific areas of your life.
